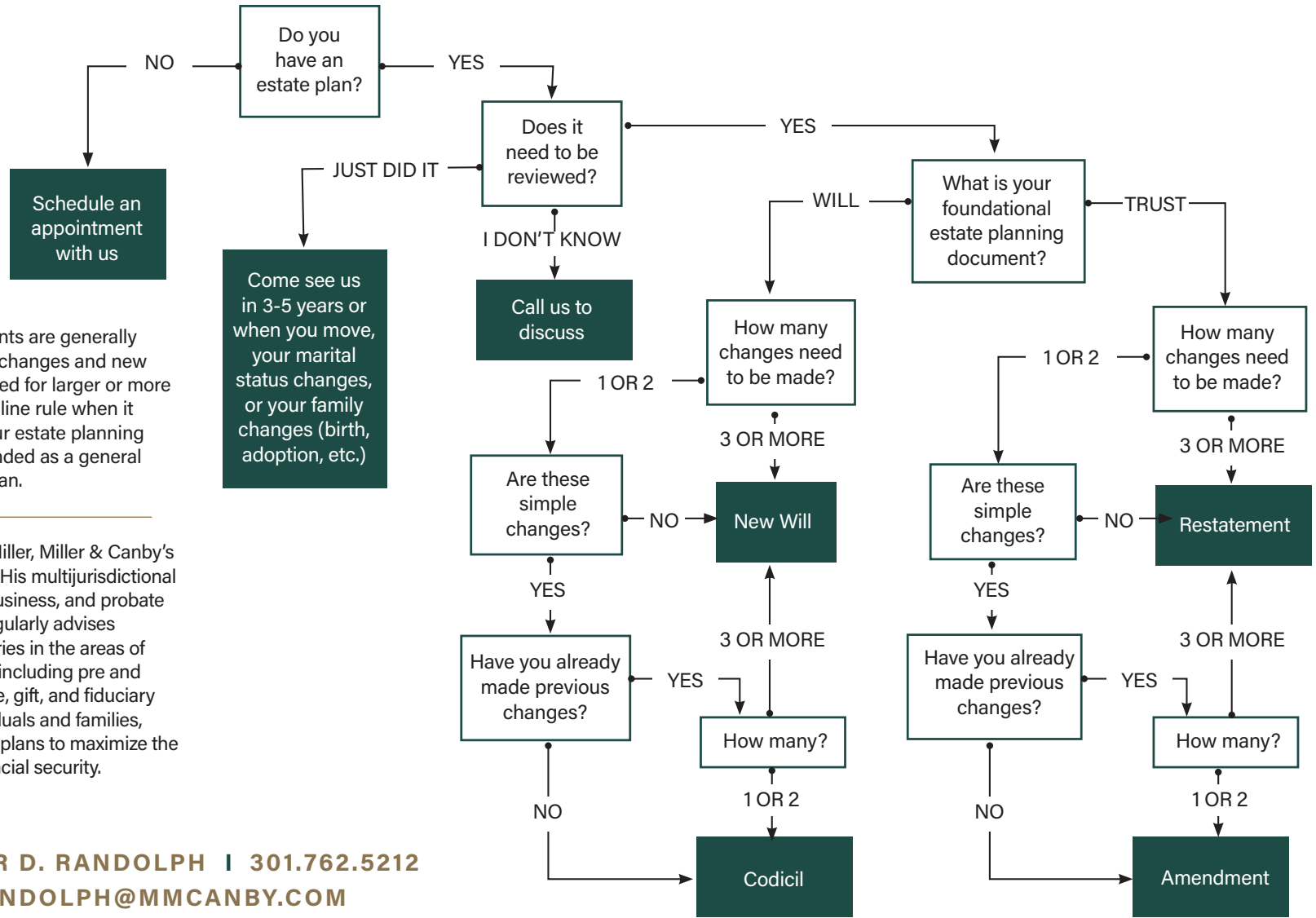


DOES YOUR ESTATE PLAN NEED AN UPDATE?
